# Interviewing a new teacher— Mr. Yim, Dexter Gareth

# Q: Thank you for your time to do this with us, Mr Yim. First of all, why did you choose to become a teacher?

**A:** It's a long story. The main reason was that I wanted to inspire students to become better people in society and help them achieve their goals as they grow up. When I was in secondary school, there was a brief moment when I felt depressed and hopeless due to academic pressure, but my English teacher, Ms Law, assisted me with my studies after school in order to improve my grades. Her dedication and perseverance inspired me to pursue a career in teaching.



# Q: What are your impressions of LKKC so far?

**A:** The way I see it, this school has a strong focus on science. Students tend to excel in Mathematics and science-related subjects. However, based on my observations, there is room for improvement in their English skills. That being said, LKKC is a renowned school not only in Tuen Mun, but also in Hong Kong— that's why I want to give myself a chance in teaching band one students and motivate them more!

# Q: Could you share how you have been implementing digital devices and online platforms during teaching?

**A:** Using online platforms for teaching is a new experience to me. For instance, I have started using *LoiLoNote* to explore its potential. I am currently in the process of learning how to effectively integrate IT platforms and devices into my teaching to enhance student learning. One approach I have adopted is converting my notes into digital files, making them more accessible to students and organised for them to revise. I have also been incorporating multimodal texts — such as utilizing short videos as teaching aids, to enhance student engagement. These videos, with their audio and visual elements, capture students' interest and stimulate their thinking, moving beyond plain text.

#### Q: What challenges do you expect to face in your teaching and how do you plan to overcome them?

**A:** In this day and age, some students lack motivation when it comes to learning English. They believe they can quickly excel in subjects like Mathematics, but struggle with comprehending authentic texts or engaging in conversations in English. As a result, their English proficiency remains stagnant and they fail to reach a higher level. I reckon that I need to devise innovative ways to motivate students to learn English as a part of their daily lives, rather than solely focusing on exams. Take writing, for instance. It is crucial for students to grasp the significance of developing their writing skills as a means of expressing their thoughts, ideas, and emotions. As the saying goes, slow progress is still progress. By immersing themselves in the language, they will eventually achieve remarkable results.

### Q: Is there anything that you would like to say to LKKC students?

**A:** Pursue your dreams, regardless of the challenges you may face. Although it may take time to accomplish your goals, the sense of satisfaction upon your achievement is invaluable. Also, your success can inspire those around you.

### Q: Which subject and forms do you teach in LKKC?

**A**: I actually teach quite a few forms but mainly, I teach regular English in F.3 and 4. I also teach the X3 classes in F.5 - those who dropped electives and I handle one of their classes. I also teach EICs in F.4 and 1.

### Q: What do you think of LKKCers so far?

A: I think that the students in LKKC know what they want. They are very goal-oriented and at the same time I believe that most of them are quite diligent.

### Q: Why did you choose to become a teacher?

**A**: When I was young, I thought that my teachers were kind of like my role models. But that wasn't really the case when it all started. I think it all started when I was studying for my master degree in Literature because half of my classmates were teachers, so what happened was that they somehow inspired me to follow their footsteps. They were quite passionate about their jobs. During that period, my classes were held at night from 6pm to 9pm. They looked tired but at the same time, they were more than happy to talk about their job, their careers, their teaching and other things. I felt that the pleasant learning environment in schools and teachers' passion are the things that made me start my career!

### Q: Why did you choose to teach in LKKC specifically?

A: Well, there are a few reasons. One is that I actually like the environment in the New Territories after having taught in quite a few schools in other areas. I've taught in schools on Hong Kong Island, and in Kowloon and New Territories. I feel that the students in the New Territories are more genuine and they're more open about their needs. I think they like to look up to their teachers and are eager to look for their teachers to help them in comparison to students in Kowloon who prefer to work on their own. Besides, LKKC is a school from STFA and I was actually looking for a school with a similar background organized by an association from China.



#### Q: What advice would you give to students who are struggling with English?

**A:** I'll say read more and listen more. Also try to imitate those who are better than you. Try to make their English "yours".

# Interviewing a new teacher - Miss Tang Yee Ting 4B Lim Yue Wing, Andrea 2B Szeto Hei Lam

L: Hi, good afternoon Miss Tang. Thank you for meeting with us today. We're going to ask you a few questions so that students can get to know you better.



# L: So first question - have you ever thought about doing something else other than teaching?

**T**: That's a good question. Since I received a bachelor's degree in Law, I had thought about going back to the law industry or doing some jobs related to public policy and documents. But I find teaching quite intriguing and interesting because I get to interact with a lot of students, and I can also implement my own teaching plan, which I find really exciting. So for now, I think I will stick with teaching.

#### S: What challenges have you faced in these few weeks?

**T**: I think the challenge that I am currently facing is trying to get used to the school and the students because it's my first year of teaching straight out of university. 
A: Thank you for inviting me to this interview. I teach F.1 Maths, F.4 and F.5 Economics this year.

# Q: Good afternoon, Miss Chan. It is an honour to have you with us. First of all, why did you choose to become a teacher?
